## Voting Rights Summit

Given the current national conversation and active legislation threatening voting rights in Black communities across the country, AAMA recognizes the importance of combating voter suppression. We are committed to spreading awareness and providing resources to make the communities that we serve ready to exercise their rights. Thus, AAMA hosted an in-person mayoral panel discussion on voting rights and what we can do to protect Black voters. This panel included AAMA President-Mayor Frank Scott Jr.-and mayors from across the state of Georgia including Mayor Andre Dickens of Atlanta (Odie Donald, II. Chief of Staff), Mayor Van Johnson of Savannah, and Mayor Angelyne Butler of Forest Park. These elected officials dug deep into election rights and the threats surrounding people's ability to cast their vote.

## From Planning to Funding: Creating a Strong Grant Application & Getting the Money for Your

This session focused on mayors getting the funds they need for their projects under the Infrastructure Investment Jobs Act (IIJA). Fund Navigator, developed by AECOM, connects data, projects and communities to show IIJA funding programs align with mayors projects and priorities. AECOM is working with clients to help analyze IIJA/BIL grant funding opportunities to advance projects that may have been put on hold, tackle long-standing infrastructure problems and expand capital plans.
